Province of Hyderabad

The Salesian Province of Hyderabad was established in 1992 to serve people in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and South Odisha. The Province is one of 12 Salesian Provinces in South Asia. The Salesians have had a presence in this region of India since 1964 where the first Salesian Home was established in Guntur, Andhra Pradesh.

Since then, the presence of the congregation in the region has grown with 201 active members with 32 Salesian Institutions as on date. These institutions consist of schools, colleges, faith oriented institutions, youth animation centres, technical schools/skill training centres, orphanages, safe homes, women empowerment groups, career guidance and job placement networks. The Province is dedicated and committed in making a difference by upholding the dignity and sanctity of human life in a region where millions of families live in extreme poverty.





Food Distributions: Dry Ration Kits



OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE

BSK'S Prolonged collaboration with its Networks



A. Don Bosco Navajeevan Homes and Safe Homes for Girls



Don Bosco Navajeevan Homes and Safe Homes for girls supported by BSK are ideally located in communities and areas where extreme poverty, large migrant populations and social service is undertaken throughout the year. These centers were mobilized to provide relief services to families affected by the lockdown. These centers were also mobilized to stitch face masks for free distribution to the poor. Around 1 lakh face masks were stitched by youth, rehabilitated at the centers over the course of seven weeks. About 30.000 face masks were donated to the Government of Telangana and its sectors while the rest of them were distributed the slum dwellers, construction labourers, small scale roadside vendors, daily labourers, the elderly, children and to the differently abled.

B. Volunteers, Youth and Young Adults

There are 500 volunteers many of whom were youth and young adults who helped package these items through its network. All health and safety precautions were followed during packaging of health kits, food packages and other materials for distribution and relief efforts.





C. Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)



CSOs are non-profits that work to advance and uphold the dignity of the human person, community, and environmental stewardship. BSK operates a programmes called the CSO Programme where 124 CSOs from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are part of this network. These CSOs are community leaders and social workers who work for the welfare of the poor. CSOs played an integral link in supporting the activities of BSK in providing relief services to communities and localities that were in desperate need of support during the lockdown.

D. Academic and Technical Schools

BSK supports a network of Academic and Technical Schools. These institutions were utilized to help collect, package and distribute food and health items to the local community. These institutions are ideally in areas and zones where target beneficiary populations were located. The lockdown also helped in providing free space in engage in such activities. In Guntur and Gunadala, the open grounds were utilized to host a public market where vegetable vendors could sell their items with social distancing collaborating with the local authorities.



E. Private Companies and Individual Donors



BSK and certain beneficiary organizations were able to receive food items and financial support to engage in social outreach services. This was an opportune time to advance corporate social responsibility and networking between independent NGOs and private organizations. Individual donors provided financial assistance during the lockdown to help grow our impact.



METHODOLOGY & WORKFLOW

During the worried Pandemic situation, there was a high need for promoting and building trust and upholding peace in order to control further panic and fear. The Economer General of the Salesians of Don Bosco / Society of St. Francis de Sales, Brother Jean Paul Muller, has issued a timely circular with recommendations, suggestions and possible preventive measures to confront the Covid-19 pandemic across the Salesian Don Bosco institutions around the world.

Bosco Seva Kendra Under the umbrella of Salesian province of Hyderabad are united to work together as one human family to face the outbreak, expressing compassion and solidarity was the need of the hour. BSK engaged in dialogue with Rectors of the Local communities, staff, Planning and Development Offices Network, South Asia, donor agencies, Civil Society Organizations, and volunteers on the effective mechanisms to implement to move forward. These were the processes BSK adopted to begin outreach effort



1. Study and Assessment of the Situation

The significant impact of the coronavirus in various sectors. It has not just taken lives of the people but also affected the means of their livelihood to keep themselves alive. BSK have been engaged in responding to the COVID-19 affected communities, especially migrant workers & daily wage laborers who stopped working which pose a major threat to lives and livelihoods due to lockdown and are unable to feed their families. The immediate response was provided by BSK to these families after their identification and listing.

Networking has been initiated at all levels – block, district, state involving various stakeholders while addressing the COVID-19 affected people. Which comprises of Government Administrations at block and district level, SHGs, Gram Panchayat, local communities, hospitals, police department, congregation and even transport department. BSK have got permission from the government authority to get engaged in action-response in this lockdown period.

2. Short-Term and Long-Term Targets: Organizational Strategy

It was focused on engaging in public awareness programes by displaying posters about the dangers of the virus within Don Bosco Institutions and the communities where our organization is present. The short-term target was to help families especially migrants and the poor affected by the lockdown. The long-term target was to develop a mechanism to ensure that marginalized communities receive support during the pandemic.

3. Mobilization of Volunteers, CSOs

As a Social organization, it was active in the region about three decades. During this pandemic, BSK mobilized volunteers, CSOs for a greater collaboration and coordination for the relief services.

4. Publication of Impact Reports and Financial Information to Benefactors

Donors, agencies, charitable organizations, institutional partners, CSR organizations and individuals were provided with weekly reports concerning the various activities undertaken during Covid-19. In addition, completion reports, and photo albums were prepared for donors during and completion of various outreach activities.



5. Collaboration with Donors on Social and Digital Media

The significant outreach efforts that have been undertaken since the end of March to till date were possible with the support of donor network. Information, documents, data, and photographs were shared in social media platforms to highlight various outreach services funded during Covid-19 pandemic. This collaboration has led new individual donors coming forward to help various efforts and programmes.

6. Press Coverage and Government Relations

Print and Digital Media carried the outreach efforts of BSK regularly and thus the activities of BSK were known far and wide with the cordial support of civil service authorities at the grassroot level of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Alongside, the similar information about relief services have been uploaded onto Home Ministry Portal, India.

7. Long Term Proposals

The organization is in the process of implementing and fundraising programmes in covid-19 pandemic times. BSK hopes to engage in activities that will provide skill training and advance the community resilience mechanisms. This includes skill training unemployed youth, providing academic support to children out of school, training of young Salesians in counselling skills, making the Salesian institution self -sustainable and women empowerment programmes through mutually aided cooperative societies (MACs) in rural and urban areas.

8. Institutional and Donor Engagement

Bosco Seva Kendra has been in the Social Service since 1993 and has a network of benefactors and institutional donors that have supported various charitable works. The project team developed proposals to provide emergency food and relief services in the last 100 days. Most of the benefactors and institutional donors have responded positively.
